The total campus area of the institution is 21348 Sq.Meter. The institution comprises of three storey building with a total constructed area of 56348.48 Sq.Ft. There are 27 classrooms, 15 laboratories, 02 seminar halls and one meditation hall in the college premises. There is a separate IQAC room to facilitate its smooth functioning which is accomplished by Computer with internet connectivity; printer, scanner, book shelves and other amenities. Teaching-learning activities are strictly monitored through IQAC and required changes are suggested time to time.
